
Events coming up in School

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Breakfast Club !

We offer a daily Breakfast Club at school to ensure all children have the opportunity to have a healthy breakfast to start the school day.

Children have access to a wide range of foods, including toast, fresh fruit, cereals, fruit juices, milk and water.

Following breakfast, children can choose from a variety of activities, including board games, drawing, colouring, or reading. At 8:20am, they can either continue their activity in the dining hall or join Mr Albinson in the hall for a daily physical activity. These activities cater to all ages and abilities, offering a fun and engaging way for children to release energy before the school day begins and interact with others in a safe and fun way. This half term, activities have included volleyball, Just Dance, bench ball, creative bowling, and whole school Rock, Paper, Scissors. Activities are refreshed every half term, with input from the children who attend.

Breakfast Club is available every day for children in Reception through to Year 6 , from 8:00am to 8:50am . The cost is £1.00 per day and payment should be made in advance or each morning through Parentpay.

Charges will be added to your ParentPay account daily when your child has attended.





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How school can help when your child needs medicine.

To ensure the safety and well-being of all pupils, there are strict guidelines regarding the administration of medication in school.

Please take note of the following:

Prescribed Medication : Any prescribed medication must be provided in its original packaging with a pharmacy label displaying the child's name and dosage instructions. Without this we are unable to administer the medication.

Non-Prescribed Medication : In some cases school administrators may be able to give children non-prescribed medication. Please speak to the school office for further information.

Medication Given 3 times a daily : If a child's medication is prescribed to be taken three times a day, we ask that parents administer this at home rather than sending to school.

Medication Storage : All medication must be handed into the school office and must not be kept in children's bags.

Consent Forms : A parent/carer must complete the required forms before any medication is given. These forms are available on the school website and at the school office.

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BUBBLES

You will take a unique look at bubbles – from the inside! Carry out experiments on bubbles, make massive bubbles. Make fizzy food by putting bubbles into food. Look at the use of bubbles in modern medicine and decide if bubbles in the blood is a good or bad thing?



SOUND

You can't see a sound wave but we can use diagrams to understand it. You will explore resonant frequency. Find out what happened to the Broughton Suspension Bridge in Salford and how this is used in musical instruments. Measure distances with sound like dolphins. Make your own panpipes and learn to measure the speed of sound with drainpipes.

PARTICLES

You will measure the size of a molecule & explore the structure of an atom just like Lord Rutherford, Geiger and Marsden did in Manchester over 100 years ago. As far as we know, they did not get to make ice-cream with liquid nitrogen but you will and you will appreciate why rapid freezing makes the best ice cream!
